Directors Report (cont.)

Governing Document

The organisation is a charitable company limited by guarantee, incorporated on the 24th of July 2008 and recognised as a charity on 27 February 2009. The company was established under a memorandum of Association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association. In the event of the company being wound up members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £1.

Risk Management

Internal control mechanisms are in place, such as the countersigning of cheques and bank transactions. An income

and expenditure statement is produced monthly for the directors to be able to supervise the activities of the company.

Organisational structure

Many of the day-to-day activities of TTF are taken forward within specific projects and "operational hubs". Project leaders have responsibility for taking these forward within parameters set by the Board of Directors, to which the project leaders report.

The company is managed on a day to day basis by Project Leaders who report to the Board of Directors (meeting every month). The Board of Directors provide legal, strategic and financial governance. The role of the Board is to conduct the business for the Company in accordance with the statutory responsibilities of Directors as set out under the Companies Acts 1985-1989 and 2006. Its roles and responsibilities are set out in detail in TTF's Memorandum and Articles of Association and include setting the company's policy and strategic direction, and managing and overseeing the projection of its public image.

Objects and activities of the charity

The charitable aims for which TTF Ltd is established are as stated in the company's Memorandum of Association:

- a) the advancement of community development,
- b) the advancement of environmental protection and improvement, including the promotion of sustainable
- c) the advancement of education, and the promotion of health

Transition Town Forres has three overall strategic aims, which are:

- To improve the situation and outlook of Forres as climate changes and fossil fuel supplies decline by 1 fostering sustainability and resilience in the local community.
- To foster positive planning to lift Forres out of fossil fuel dependency. 2
- To encourage and promote health, choice and empowerment for the people of Forres and local community 3 networks, within an ecologically and ethically grounded framework.

Achievements and Performance

Thank you to all our current and past project holders and sessional workers for their commitment to support the people of Forres. Support in having a space to grow food, to cook freshly picked vegetables in creative ways, to have a warm clear space for holding events, to learn sewing skills and share stories. Thank you to our current and past Board of Directors for all their skills, input and willingness to keep Transition Town Forres Ltd operational and effective for coming up 9 years. Thank you to all our volunteers and supporters, and self-employed workers caring for our centre, the gardens and for all the work they do in Forres creating a more resilient future.

This financial year we successfully ran Reskilling/Upcycling Sewing classes with Marit and Terri through the second half of 2015 with grant funding received from Canny Wi Cash (TSI Moray) and Age Scotland. The classes brought a variety of different ages/abilities together to learn a skill and be together.

The 'Food School' successfully run and rebranded by Rob and Rosie to 'Let's Eat' has yet again met its aims and objectives and delivered many 'Confidence to Cook' sessions funded by the Eat Canny Partnership, a contract received by NHS. Rob and Rosie have been successfully outreaching and creating workshops in collaboration with community-based groups interested in learning how to cook nutritious food economically. Some of these include Community Food Moray, Works and Pensions Department, Step by Step, BALL, Stepping Out, and Men's Shed. Let's Eat has been in the Forres Gazette many times sharing stories and celebrations of a fabulous team enjoying what they do.

We ran 2 Tattie Days, 1 at Tesco and the other at our centre, with many heritage potato varieties making their way to Forres homes and being harvested now! We purchased bulk Organic Compost for our community garden folks and others to take advantage of savings and ensuring organic compost was spread around. Both these initiates broke even financially.

We have been awarded funding from People's Health Trust to run free Wellbeing classes for specific postcode areas and ages in Forres. These will begin in 2016/17 and run for 2 years. Thank you to the original team who pulled together this funding application.

In addition to this, we are looking forward to working more with members, friends, partners and supporters to create a more formalised plan for Taking Transition Forward in Forres.

Investment policy

Aside from retaining a prudent amount in reserves each year most of the charity's funds are to be spent in the short term so there are few funds for long term investment.

Financial Review

During the year the charity received funding and donations totalling £15,810. Total resources expended were £47,377, resulting in a net deficit of £31,553. £27,703 of this expenditure was the depreciation charge for the year. Capital expenditure in the year amounted to £2,389.16 (see note 6 to the financial statements)

Principal Funding Sources

The main source of income for the charity has been grants.

Reserves policy

The board of directors has examined the charity's requirements for reserves in light of the main risks to the organisation. There is currently £90,638 of reserves which is primarily made up of assets (property improvements of £120,597 and debtors (prepaid lease) of £12,728. Actual cash held at bank at the year end totalled £16,660.

Plans for the future

TTF's plans for the future are to increase the use of the Environmental Education and Healthy Living Centre. There are now practical & educational programmes around healthy food. Focus will be placed on how to grow & cook local & seasonal food and to provide information on the impact of food for wellbeing.

Responsibilities of the Board of Directors

Company law requires the Board of Directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of the affairs of the charitable company as at the balance sheet date and of its incoming resources and application of resources, including income and expenditure, for the financial year. In preparing those financial statements, the Board of Directors should follow best practice and:

- 1. Make suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- 2. Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and
- 3. Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate assume that the company will continue on that basis.

The Board of Directors is also responsible for maintaining proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and to enable them to ensure that they financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. The Board of Directors is also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Faith Simpson, Chartered Certified Accountant, was appointed as the Reporting Accountant in the current year and has expressed her willingness to be reappointed at the AGM.

1 Accounting Policies

a Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 And the Charities and Trustees Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006.

b Fund Accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the directors in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor.

c Incoming Resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. Voluntary income is recorded on a cash received basis. Investment income is included when receivable.

Incoming resources from charitable activities are accounted for when earned.

d Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure is includes any vat which cannot be fully recovered and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries.

Costs of managing and administering the charity represent costs incurred by finance, human resources, accounting, legal and other costs attributable to the management of the charity's assets, organisational administration and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.

Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:
