Directors Report

Governing Document

The organisation is a charitable company limited by guarantee, incorporated on the 24th of July 2008 and recognised as a charity on 27 February 2009. The company was established under a memorandum of Association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association. In the event of the company being wound up members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £1.

Risk Management

Internal control mechanisms are in place, such as the countersigning of cheques and bank transactions. An income and expenditure statement is produced monthly for the directors to be able to supervise the activities of the company.

Organisational structure

Many of the day-to-day activities of TTF are taken forward within specific projects and "operational hubs". Project leaders have responsibility for taking these forward within parameters set by the Board of Directors, to which the project leaders report.

The company is managed on a day to day basis by Project Leaders who report to the Board of Directors (meeting every month). The Board of Directors provide legal, strategic and financial governance. The role of the Board is to conduct the business for the Company in accordance with the statutory responsibilities of Directors as set out under the Companies Acts 1985-1989 and 2006. Its roles and responsibilities are set out in detail in TTF's Memorandum and Articles of Association and include setting the company's policy and strategic direction, and managing and overseeing the projection of its public image.

Objects and activities of the charity

The charitable aims for which TTF Ltd is established are as stated in the company's Memorandum of Association:

- a) the advancement of community development,
- b) the advancement of environmental protection and improvement, including the promotion of sustainable development.
- c) the advancement of education, and the promotion of health

Transition Town Forres has three overall strategic aims, which are:

- To improve the situation and outlook of Forres as climate changes and fossil fuel supplies decline by fostering sustainability and resilience in the local community.
- To foster positive planning to lift Forres out of fossil fuel dependency.
- To encourage and promote health, choice and empowerment for the people of Forres and local community networks, within an ecologically and ethically grounded framework.

Achievements and Performance

We would like to thank everyone who has been involved with TTF over recent years but 2016 to 2017 involved participation from two Directors who have stepped down...Kristy Puplett and Deborah Hockney. Both the indoor and the outdoor spaces have been well used in ways that have become established in recent years but with a few new additions too. We remain open to new ideas that make best use of the spaces and resources we have. Given the changes that are sweeping through society, not least of them being climate change and resource depletion, we must adapt and seek new opportunities to remain relevant and useful.

Organisations that TTF has engaged with have included Forres DWP, Quarriers Carers, Moray Foodbank, Autistic One-Stop Shop, Essential Skills Adult Literacy Group, Forres Academy, Moray Feelgood Festival, Logie Primary School & Kinloss Primary School for Health Week, Aberlour Youth Group and St Leonards Outreach.

The Let's Eat programme led by Rob and Rosie but supported by many cooks and individuals these people are making a real difference to the cooking skills, health and wellbeing of the community. We are also aware of at least 1 person who has secured employment through the skills they learned here. This was particularly well received by the carers themselves. People were also welcomed from low income households who were referred to TTF for help in keeping their food bills under control while also learning new cooking skills. Let's Eat are to be commended for this work which kept the profile of TTF high in Forres but also in the wider area of Moray. They also welcomed Quarriers charity who used the indoor space and the gardens to give a welcome respite to people who are full time carers.

The Wellbeing project has been a great success at bringing new people to the centre. Emma Stewart has done a great job and has been complemented by the Funders on the excellent delivery of the project. The project provides free transport, and the classes are free to ensure that money is not a barrier to people accessing community activities. The funders are also very clear that the project is to focus on social and economic deprivation. Since Autumn 2016, 80 people have attended at least one class, with 56 people committing to classes and meeting regularly. The classes have received very positive feedback: 77% feel more empowered and involved in a community project, 95% have learnt a new skill, 91% have become more active, 97% feel better in general and 100% feel less isolated and more connected to their community. People are starting to socialise together out with classes, stay after classes to have tea/biscuits/get to know each other, share crafting skills, and even have gone on holiday together! It has also been a benefit to Transition Town Forres as it has resulted in many of the projects' participants coming to the centre for the first time. This has resulted in barriers being broken down, and a new engagement with the centre as a community resource to be shared with the people of Forres.

Mention must also be given to the Monday night stalwarts who drum their way through all four seasons. Classes for beginners and more advanced players have been slowly growing in size and a good variety of ages from both men and women have been regular attendees. There have also been dancing classes of various kinds and the message that the TTF centre is an excellent venue has spread beyond its past spheres.

Tattie day was run again although on a smaller scale than previous years. Potatoes were made available to the public and also TTF gardeners at events held at TTF but also at Tesco.

The Big Picnic was organised as part of a national day to encourage social cohesion. The first event was a great success and good weather and local musicians helped the day along. The sharing of food and the opportunity to make new friends was eagerly taken up by old and young alike.

The community garden at TTF is at full membership of 70 people and has become self sustaining over 8 years having been funded initially by the Climate Challenge Fund. The garden has gone through a 4 year organic conversion process. There have been a number of environmental education workshops in pollination and composting skills.

We hosted a "Taking Transition Forward' evening in November 2016 where people interested in the work of the organisation had the opportunity to play their part in shaping its future. The evening resulted in a list of priorities and projects and this business plan focuses on the ones the company has agreed to take forward for the period 2016-2019. The plan also looks at how we aim to go about increasing our own income in ways which are both realistic and achievable.

So, all being said and done TTF is holding its own. However, the reasons behind the Transition movement have not gone away but have in fact intensified. The ground is shifting and members are welcome to step forward with new ideas that can help to secure the future for TTF and the community of Forres and Moray.

Investment policy

Aside from retaining a prudent amount in reserves each year most of the charity's funds are to be spent in the short term so there are few funds for long term investment.

Financial Review

During the year the charity received funding and donations totalling £53,856. Total resources expended were £53,285, resulting in a net surplus of £571.00. £21,867 of this expenditure was the depreciation charge for the year.

Principal Funding Sources

The main source of income for the charity has been grants.

Reserves policy

The board of directors has examined the charity's requirements for reserves in light of the main risks to the organisation. There is currently £91,209 of reserves which is primarily made up of assets (property improvements of £122,397 and debtors (prepaid lease) of £9,091. Actual cash held at bank at the year end totalled £43,361.

Plans for the future

TTF's plans for the future are to increase the use of the Environmental Education and Healthy Living Centre. There are now practical & educational programmes around healthy food. Focus will be placed on how to grow & cook local & seasonal food and to provide information on the impact of food for wellbeing.

Responsibilities of the Board of Directors

Company law requires the Board of Directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of the affairs of the charitable company as at the balance sheet date and of its incoming resources and application of resources, including income and expenditure, for the financial year. In preparing those financial statements, the Board of Directors should follow best practice and:

- 1. Make suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- 2. Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and
- 3. Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate assume that the company will continue on that basis.

The Board of Directors is also responsible for maintaining proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and to enable them to ensure that they financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. The Board of Directors is also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Reporting Accountant

Faith Simpson, Chartered Certified Accountant, was appointed as the Reporting Accountant in the current year and has expressed her willingness to be reappointed at the AGM.

1 Accounting Policies

a **Accounting convention**

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 And the Charities and Trustees Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006.

b Fund Accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the directors in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor.

c Incoming Resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Voluntary income is recorded on a cash received basis.

Investment income is included when receivable.

Incoming resources from charitable activities are accounted for when earned.

d Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure is includes any vat which cannot be fully recovered and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries.

Costs of managing and administering the charity represent costs incurred by finance, human resources, accounting, legal and other costs attributable to the management of the charity's assets, organisational administration and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.

e Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:
